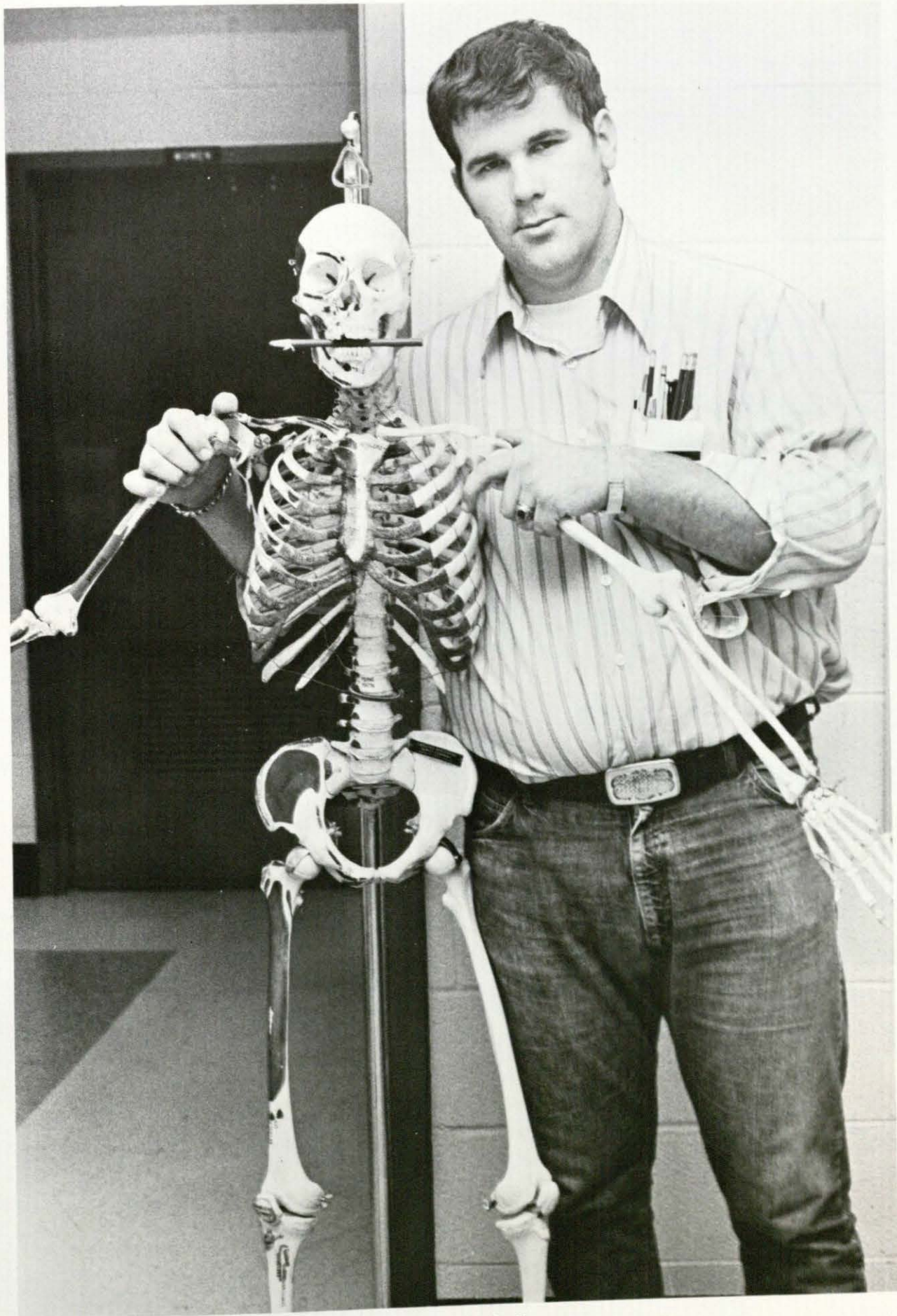
Lonnie has offered to help anyone in any way if he can be of service. For a man who may be physically short in stature, he truly stands tall among the rest of us in determination and courage.
